\$500

can support one of these

- 1 high school student receives dropout prevention services to stay in school and succeed in life.
- 1 caregiver receives 80 hours of respite care for their loved ones by providing a safe and caring environment that supports the health needs or a frail or impaired adult.
- 2 families receive emergency assistance with housing or utilities, to prevent eviction and keep their children in school.
- 5 children go to summer day camp for the first time ever.

- 5 individuals in need of assistance are connected to the right services and supports necessary to help them on the path to self-sufficiency.
- 18 children (birth to 5) receive Family Literacy Packs to support parent-child shared reading routines to develop the pre-literacy skills needed to enter Kindergarten ready to learn.
- 50 adults complete job readiness and employability skills classes, building both their confidence and skills to succeed in obtaining a new job or better career.
- 1 family receives intervention services and supports focused on improving parenting skills and family functioning to reduce incidences of child abuse or neglect.

- 25 children receive a scholarship to help pay for a week of quality child care so their parents can work or attend school.
- A year of bus passes or gas cards enable parents and children to get to classes and services that help them get ahead in life.
- A year of month of nutritious meals and social supports delivered to a homebound or otherwise vulnerable older adult.

- 50 children receive a scholarship to help pay for a week of quality child care so their parents can work or attend school.
- 10 families receives financial assistance for deposits to get electricity and water in a new apartment of their own.
- 10 youth develop life skills to avoid repeating disruptive behavior that prevents school success.
- 10 expectant or new mothers have increased access to appropriate prenatal & preventative care.

- Up to 50 adults receive 1 year of financial coaching to learn better ways to manage money to reach their economic goals.
- 5 uninsured low-income individuals receive comprehensive dental care.
- 50 individuals whose personal safety is at risk are protected from a dangerous situation.
- 2 seniors receive occupational therapy and home accessibility modifications.

\$7,500

- 5 mentor/mentee relationships advance to support character development.
- 12 individuals/families experiencing homelessness become and/or remain adequately sheltered or housed.

- 7 infants, toddlers, and preschoolers are cared for on-site at a Family Success Center, freeing parents to focus on their classes.
- 29 individuals increase their well-being by achieving health goals and improving health outcomes.
