Investment

- \$75,000 to \$125,000 per program
- Funds only for services for clients in poverty in Greater Greensboro
- 1 year grant

Grantee Expectations

- Collect verified household data and track changes over time
- Quarterly progress reporting
- Obtain client consent to share personally identifiable information

Why does UWGG want PII?

- Gauge more accurate progress
- Collect demographics

What will UWGG do with the information?

- Compile into searchable spreadsheet
- Identify likely duplicates
- Observe trends
- Report out summarized information.

What will UWGG NOT do with the information?

- Contact clients
- Share information internally or externally



What is UWGG Looking For?

- Application focused only on clients working toward Bold Goal
- Accelerate or improve your work by:
 - Adding new services to existing program
 - Expanding or enhancing services
 - Increasing access
 - Removing barriers through direct client assistance and partnership
- Collaboration

COLLABORATION:

2 or more programs or organizations that show coordination of services to achieve better client outcomes



Eligibility

- See RFA page 4
- Program operating for at least 2 years
- At least one paid FTE
- Funds only used for Greater Greensboro
- Agency has NC Solicitation License
- Agency can provide financial documentation outlined on RFA page 6
